The Shorthorn Breed is one of the oldest in the world, with breeding going back almost 200 years. The breed has played a major part in the development of the cattle industry throughout the world. In the great beef producing countries, Australia and Argentina, Shorthorns are numbered in millions.

In recent years much has been done to adapt the breed to meet modern requirements. The time has come to let it be known that in the UK,

Shorthorn cattle are available to meet the needs of the discriminating commercial producer of beef. There is no doubt they are needed. We are all conscious that many suckler herds consist of cows of uncertain breeding and background. Visiting overseas Cattlemen have remarked with dismay on the deterioration in the type of our commercial beef herds. The Shorthorn, properly used, can do a great deal to put this right; either by the introduction of Shorthorn or first-cross Shorthorn females, or by the use of a Shorthorn bull to provide replacements.

Thanks to the efforts of a number of devoted breeders in recent years, it can fairly be claimed that the Shorthorn has regained the right to the title of "The Great Improver". Employed in the correct way the Shorthorn bull will generally justify this description.

While cattle are wanted that are hardy and can stay outside all winter; that calve regularly and easily over many years; that rear a calf under difficult conditions; and that thrive on a simple diet without expensive cereals - then the Shorthorn is indispensable.
